Dear CH Bird Families,

It is with great excitement that I welcome you to the 2018-2019 school year! Things to know:

Drop off/Pick up: Drop off no earlier than 7:45 in the morning, we do not have supervision for students before that time. Remember to follow our <u>traffic safety plan</u>. Please continue to pull all the way forward in the line before dropping off or picking up students at door 8. If you want to walk your student to the playground or pick them up on the playground, park in a parking space to the left of the drop off/pick up line or on St. Albert the Great drive and cross at the crosswalk. Do not park or get out of your car to meet or walk kids in the pick up line. If it is raining, still drop off in the drop off line and students will enter school from the back doors.

<u>CH Best</u> meets the second Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. in the CH Bird Library. CH Best is our supportive parent group that helps our school in many ways from helping finance school projects to providing fun family events for all. Volunteering at School or Field Trips


****Background Check Needed Every 3 Years ****



Watch Dogs





DRAMA CLUB



Lice Happens!



Fall is the season of: back to school, football, pumpkins, Halloween costumes, and lice? Yes lice. Summer camps, vacations, sleep-overs, and sports with helmets can all be prime opportunities for sharing lice. Did you know that the average person has had lice for 4-6 weeks before it is discovered? That makes this time of the year one of the peak seasons for lice discovery.

Now is a great time to get in the habit of checking your child's scalp periodically for lice.

What to look for:

- Intense itching and scratching of the scalp
- Visible redness or sores from itching
- To check child's head for lice it is best to be in a well-lit room or natural sunlight. Be on the look-out for nits (eggs) and lice
- Nits are tiny tear-drop shaped eggs that attach to the hair shaft. They often appear yellowish-whitish and can look like dandruff, but cannot be washed off or blown away like dandruff can.
- Lice are small insects the size of a sesame seed. They can adapt to match hair color, but are usually tan or gray. They do not jump or fly, but they move quickly and can be hard to see. Lice often are found around the ears or on the nape of the neck.

What to do if nits or lice are found

Check all household members' heads and treat anyone with lice or nits. There are many different over the counter, prescription, and homeopathic options. For more information you can contact your school nurse or health care provider.

Please notify your child's school and daycare. This helps us in tracking and efforts in preventing transmission in school. It is also a good idea to notify any close contacts such as friends, teammates, neighbors, or extended family.

Welcome back to another exciting school year! As you are getting back into the routine, remember to take advantage of the WSRA website (<u>www.wsro.org</u>) which has Calendars of Ideas in the Families and Literacy section . These include several book titles as well as many ideas for how to engage your family in literacy activities at home. Also, make sure you are taking the time to read daily by establishing a routine, whether before bedtime, right away in the morning, or another part of the day you can find in your schedule!

Though it's an exciting time of year, the start of school can create some anxious feelings when considering a change in routine, new people, and a need for making new friends. Sometimes these conversations can be tough to have, so consider the use of picture books to help get the discussion started. Talking through these feelings with your child can help them prepare and feel at ease.

Family Tips



Some topics are tough to tackle like divorce or a death in the family. One way to help is by reading a story about a character who has experienced similar circumstances. This will help you facilitate a discussion to meet your child's social/emotional needs during this difficult time.

When selecting books for your child, remember you can utilize your library's search engine to find books that reflect your family's current needs. The library's website usually has a spot for searching about topics, which you can access at home or on the computers when you get there.

Another way to help your child feel excited about reading is to tap into their interests. Think about what your child likes to do or is interested in, then get books to match. When looking for books of your child's interests, don't forget your local librarian is a great resource and person to ask!



ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

September 05, 2018

- As a result of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHFRA), every school district is required to complete a comprehensive asbestos inspection and develop a management plan for all asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), present within the district. In an effort to comply with this regulation, the Sun Prairie Area School District had all buildings owned or leased by the District initially inspected by an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), accredited inspector and any samples taken and analyzed by an independent laboratory. This information was then utilized to develop a comprehensive asbestos management plan.
- A comprehensive re-inspection by an accredited inspector of all ACBM is required every 3 years, while periodic 6-month surveillance is an additional requirement. Beginning in July, 1998, the Sun Prairie Area School District contracted Environmental Management Consulting, Inc. (EMC), to perform 3- year re-inspections and 6-month surveillances for all district buildings.
- Environmental Management Consulting, Inc. has completed the most recent comprehensive asbestos inspection and management plan, with this report available for your review during normal business hours in the Facilities and Grounds office. Copies of this report are also available to upon request.
- All ACBM found within the District has been identified, with location and condition assessed. Any areas noted as being in moderate to poor condition will be repaired or removed. A district long-range management plan of all ACBM has been developed.
