April 1-7, 2023 has been designated as The Week of the Young Child®!

This is an annual celebration sponsored by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the world's largest early childhood education association, with nearly 60,000 members and a network of 52 Affiliates.

The purpose of the Week of the Young Child® is to focus public attention on the needs of young children and their families and to recognize the early childhood programs and services that meet those needs.

NAEYC first established the Week of the Young Child® in 1971, recognizing that the early childhood years (birth through age 8) lay the foundation for children's success in school and later life. The Week of the Young Child® is a time to plan how we—as citizens of a community, of a state, and of a nation—will better meet the needs of all young children and their families.

Today we know more than ever before about the importance of children's earliest years in shaping their learning and development. Yet, never before have the needs of young children and their families been more pressing.

The Week of the Young Child® is a time to recognize that children's opportunities are our responsibilities, and to recommit ourselves to ensuring that each and every child experiences the type of early environment—at home, at child care, at school, and in the community—that will promote their early learning.

REMINDER TO REGISTER FOR K2K SUMMER SCHOOL

We are happy to remind you that registration for the Sun Prairie Area School District Summer School program is open! We are excited that many families took advantage of registering starting on March 14, 2023. We wanted to ensure that you were aware of the registration opportunity.

We are including the <u>link to a message</u> that includes all of the information we have sent earlier. Hopefully, this information includes everything you need to register your children. <u>The Sun Prairie Area School District Summer School website</u> also includes links to all of the information that was sent to families.

A couple of reminders:

- Please register your child for the same grade level that they are currently in at this time (e.g., students in grade 3 in Spring 2023 should be registered for grade 3 in Summer School).
- If your child qualifies for district bus transportation, please select the "transportation" class in registration. Students must have a full schedule to be included in district

transportation (e.g., K2K for PreK, KBF for Kindergarten, 4 classes for all others).

- Select the classes for your children and also select alternative classes.
- You will not get a confirmation message when you finish. Watch the completion progress bar as you fill out the form.

KOBUSSEN BUS-

- · Buses can be noisy places. Please help your child remember to use their "0-1"voices, so the drivers can be safe. Sometimes, when bus drivers have to speak loudly to be heard, our kiddos mistake loud for "yelling". We have given the bus drivers this tool to help our 4K students understand what kind of voice they should be using on the bus. It is also used in our classrooms so your children should be familiar with the tool and the language used.
- · Stayingseated in their seats is very important. Even if the ride is short please help us to reinforce the need to stay sitting in their seats, until the teacher comes to get them off the bus.
- · Please be prepared to meet your child's bus 10-15 minutes before the scheduled bus times you have been given. Due to

absences and our door to door busing the bus times may vary within that time frame.

· If your child is not going to be riding the bus to or from school please let the bus company AND your teacher know. We want to make sure we know exactly who is getting on and off the bus every day. The bus company can be reached at 825-8700.
