From Kobussen Bus Company Bus Delays and Emergencies



Parents, please remember that if your child's bus is delayed and/or evacuated for any reason (bus breakdown, emergency, etc) students are not allowed to leave the scene. Students must stay with the driver and wait for further instructions. If another bus is dispatched, students are to ride that bus and only get off at their assigned stop. #### Winter Bus Reminders

As cold and snowy weather is upon us we would like to remind families of a few safety issues when students are waiting for the bus in the morning. Students should:

be waiting at their bus stop at least 5 minutes before the scheduled arrival time.

be dressed appropriately for waiting in cold weather. This includes jackets, hats, gloves/mittens, and scarves.

stay out of the road and other's yards and driveways when waiting for the bus. Wait on the sidewalk or as close to the curb as possible if there are no sidewalks.

wait on their side of the road and only cross when the driver signals.

never run toward the bus as it's coming to a stop. Please wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before approaching to board.

remain seated when on the bus. When it's time to get off, wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before standing to avoid injury if the bus slides as it's stopping.

#### **Absences**

Our Eastside Phone number is 834-7400. After the message Press #1 for the attendance line. This line is available to parents **24 hours a day**. Please call the attendance line before 9:00 a.m. to report a child's absence. We **must have** a REASON for the absence or the student will be unexcused.



#### **Pre-Excused Absences**

If your family is planning an absence, please indicate in writing the dates that your child will be gone, and the reason. Send this to school before the day of absence. Students are expected to make up all homework due to absences.

#### **Attendance Procedures**

While we understand that the parent is responsible for school attendance, we must be accountable for the attendance record of each child. The state of Wisconsin has changed the definition of truancy. Truancy is defined as part of /all of five or more days during a semester. Without the written notification of excused absences, your child might be considered truant. This is in addition to our concerns for the academic struggles that arise when you child has increased absences. School district policy JER outlines the definitions and procedures in more detail. Please contact me if you would like a copy of that policy.

#### **Locked School Doors**

School doors to the building will be LOCKED at 7:50 a.m. during the school day for the protection and safety of ALL children and staff during the school day. The <u>exception</u> will be the Front Door Entrance. This door has a camera which monitors those entering our building. There are signs directing those who enter to check in at the office, show a picture ID and receive a visitor or volunteer nametag. It is especially important that these procedures are followed in light of the recent unfortunate happenings at too many of our schools across the state and nation.

Even if you are a frequent visitor or volunteer, this procedure needs to be done each time. Any staff seeing someone in the building that is not a student or another staff member, will ask the person to return to the office for a name tag.

So, whether you are arriving at school to attend a class presentation, concert, bring in a lunch or birthday treat, etc. Please sign in at the main office.

#### **Volunteering at School or Field Trips**

Please remember to fill out the form to have a background check if you want to volunteer at school or chaperone a field trip in the future. It is important that you plan ahead as a background check has been taking about a week or longer at this time, and we do not want to turn away any volunteers.

#### Lost and Found

With the winter weather here, your children will be wearing clothing items such as hats, mittens, scarves, boots, etc. By taking, a few moments to label your child's possessions much confusion can be eliminated and prompt return of lost items.

Please encourage your youngsters who have already lost items to check our lost and found. Items will be displayed by the play-ground doors Items not claimed will be donated to a charitable organization.

#### **WEATHER RULES**

Please remind your children to dress appropriately for the weather.

Students will have outdoor recess unless the weather is rainy, stormy, or too cold (below zero temperature or wind chill below zero), please be sure they come to school with warm jackets, hats, mittens/gloves, and boots.

Playground supervision begins at 7:50 a.m. Students should not be dropped off prior to this time. We would like to avoid possible problems on the playground that might upset a child's school day and interfere with their learning. Please have your child plan their departure time so that they arrive at Eastside between 7:55 a.m. and 8:15 a.m. Your continued support is needed and appreciated.

Student are not allowed in school before 8:15 a.m. unless they are being tutored, are in a club or having breakfast.

#### There is no indoor supervision.

Please talk to your child about the rules on the playground when there is snow on the ground. If they are wearing boots/snow pants they can play in the snow. If they are not wearing boots/snow pants they will have to stay on the blacktop. This is for all grade levels.
